



## **FISHING REPORT - 2 JUNE 2008**

As the season comes to a close this coming weekend, fishing conditions continue to improve. The river has been kept at a low level now for a month and there has been a lot more visible trout activity.

The section below Blowering has continued to produce good numbers of fish, but most have been on the small side. Last weekend we had close to a full house including a number of novice and intermediate fishermen and women of all ages, and just about everyone went home having achieved success on the river.

Some of our private access spots have also started yielding larger fish and that should continue over this weekend. Fish have been caught on the dry as well as good takes on the nymph. Water levels and weather have all been conducive to good fishing conditions.

Our drift boats were dry last weekend as the river finally fell to a level where traversing log jams etc was difficult. With the river up slightly this week there are still some sections driftable.

Our private trout ponds continue to yield some trophy size fish on the dry fly, particularly around dusk when there have been good hatches.

With log fires every night and great food and company, there are just a few days left to come and have a great luxury fly-fishing experience.
